Kimberlee McKay, MD FACOG is the Clinical Vice President of the Avera OB/GYN Service Line which serves 14 hospitals throughout eastern South Dakota, western Minnesota, Iowa, and Nebraska. Throughout her tenure, she has worked to support rural facilities and physicians who provide obstetrical care. Her teams leverage telemedicine to help support physicians and other care providers in their home setting through asynchronous MFM Telemedicine, Synchronous General OB/GYN Telemedicine, Gestational Diabetes Telehealth and eLearning. Her work to address the maternal mortality crisis has been published in the New England Journal of Medicine.



Rosalyn Perkins, MNsc, APRN, WHCNP-BC, Women's Health Nurse Practitioner and Director of Operations at the Institute for Digital Health & Innovation at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. She is an award recipient for contributions to the health and welfare of mothers and babies in Arkansas, and widely regarded as a go-to resource on healthcare access and management through telemedicine programs. Her aim is to "ensure that every woman in Arkansas at risk of having a complicated pregnancy receives the best possible perinatal care."



Eleni Tsigas is the Chief Executive Officer of the Preeclampsia Foundation, the North American patient advocacy organization for hypertensive disorders of pregnancy. She serves on the Executive Council of MoMMA's Voices, a coalition of maternal health patient advocacy organizations, on the Council on Patient Safety in Women's Healthcare, the Equitable Maternal Health Coalition, a Supporting Partner to the AIM Program, a technical advisor to the World Health Organization and several global health research programs and is the Principal Investigator for The Preeclampsia Registry.
